Best Practice

The work of the Pet Responsibility Committee is a recognized "best practice" across NC where we have conducted:

- Two workshops for the NC Department of Agriculture, Animal Welfare Section and Spay/Neuter Program
- Two sessions at NC Animal Rabies and Control Association Conventions
- Two sessions at NC School Counselors' Association Conventions
- Consultations with 23
 NC counties

The efforts of the Pet Responsibility Committee together with the work of The Spay and Neuter Veterinary Clinic of the Sandhills and local rescue groups have helped reduce intake at The Animal Center of Moore County from 5,000 in 2008 to 2,105 in 2017.
