### Activity 1: Spay and Neuter

- What do the words <u>spay</u>, <u>neuter</u> and <u>fixed</u> mean?
  - There is an operation performed only by a veterinarian that prevents dogs and cats having puppies and kittens.
  - The word "spay" refers to the operation for female pets. The term "neuter," while usually used for male pets, can be used to describe the operation for either female or male pets. Sometimes people just say "fixed" for both males and females.

### Activity 3 A Tale of Two Pets

Snowball and Barney were lucky to end up at the shelter where they were safe and at least had a chance of finding a new forever home.

Even so, Barney was afraid and nervous in the shelter.

The staff at the shelter found out Snowball was pregnant!



## Snowball and the Flakes!

Snowball went to a foster home where she gave birth to TWELVE puppies!

Cute as they were, there were now 13 dogs to find homes for!

Snowball felt safe and cared-for in her foster home where she waited for her new home.





Now look at the second red bar Is it a lot shorter? **YES!** That's because by 2018 there were less pets ending up at the shelter The fourth graders had been spreading the word and people were getting their pets fixed! The more pets are fixed, the less pets in the shelter!

The blue bar represents ALL the fourth graders in Moore County. That's a lot of kids! Look at how much taller the first red bar is that represents the huge number of pets who ended up at The Animal Center in 2010 - the county shelter - like Snowball and Barney.

- The pet (dog/cat) must be at least 4 months of age (nursing mothers must be at least 12 weeks from giving birth to a litter). An admission form will be provided by the Clinic which I agree to complete prior to the day of surgery.
- I will submit a copy of the pet's rables record. If I do not have one, I agree to purchase the rables vaccination on the date of the surgery for a fee of approximately \$7.00. This fee will be collected by the Clinic on the day of the surgery.
- 3. Should the Student win the Contest, I understand that the spay/neuter fee will be the ONLY fee/cost paid to the Clinic by the Pet Responsibility Committee in association with The Moore County Kennel Club. If any other medical issues arise during the surgery that may cause additional medical fee/costs, I will be notified prior thereto and will be responsible for only the additional fees which I approve in advance. I specifically grant permission to the Sandhills Pet Gazette, the Moore County Kennel Club, the Companion Animal Clinic Foundation, the Pet Responsibility Committee and the Pilot Newspaper to publish the Student's name, photograph and/or story.
- 4.
