The winners of the prizes won their award by writing a story explaining how they could be more responsible pet owners by having their pets spayed or

neutered. These procedures will be done at the Sandhills Spay and Neuter Veterinary Clinic and costs are covered by the Moore County Kennel Club. Five Highfalls students won these awards and they were Leah, Brooklyn, Patsy, Haylee, and Brandon. Speuter helped Bill present the awards.

During this six-week curriculum, the students are given white lunch bags to decorate in Art class. These bags are presented to the Spay and Neuter Clinic for dispensing post-procedure medications for the dogs

and cats. Four students were selected to receive this "Star Artist Award" for outstanding art on their bags and they were Kamryn, Ella, Madalyn, and Sierra.

Speuter not only helped present all the awards, but also read her heartwarming poem about how she was rescued and given a much better life.

The guest speaker for the celebration was Dr. Tim Boyte, recently retired owner of Car-
